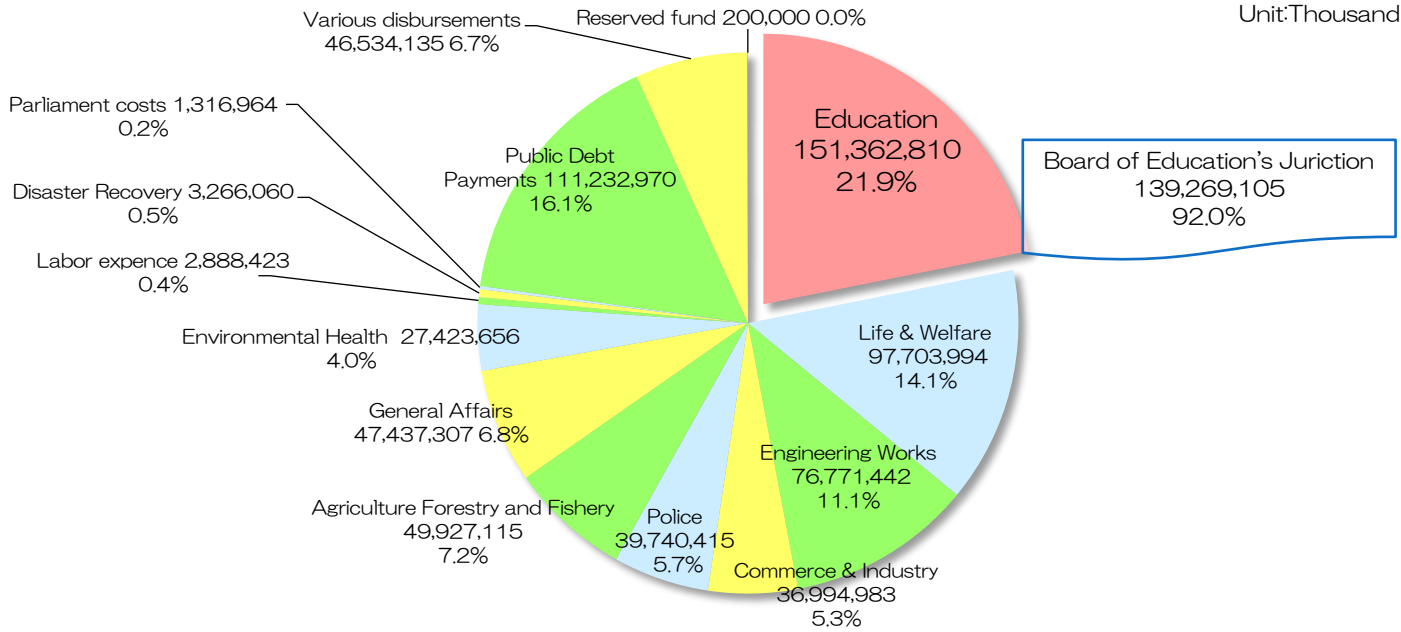

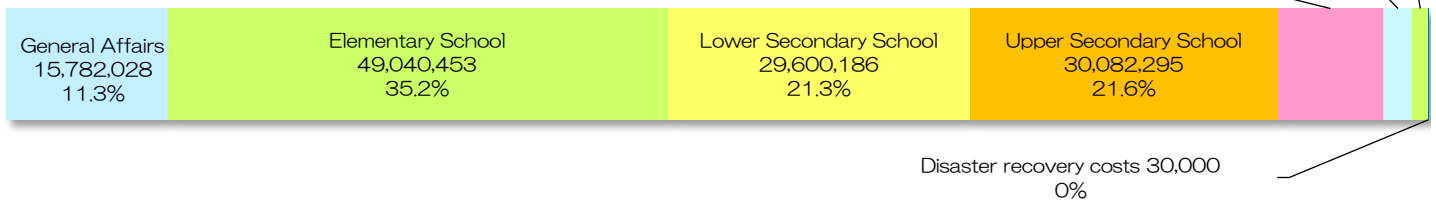

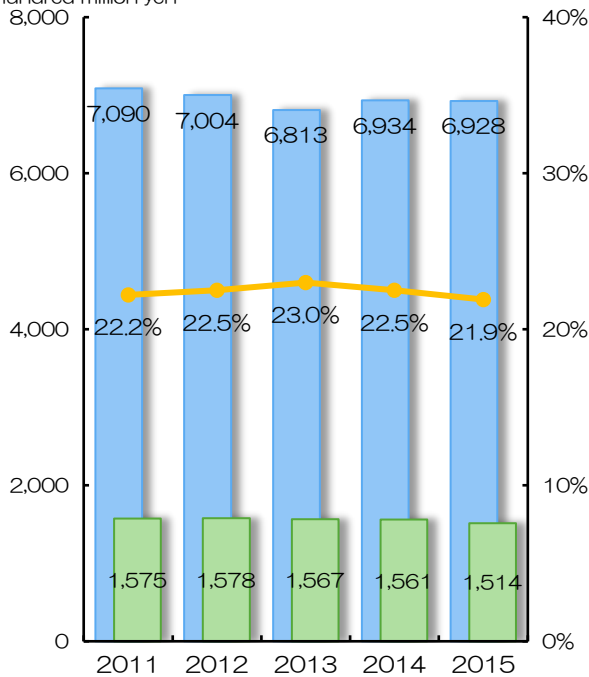

## Prefectural Expenditure on Education

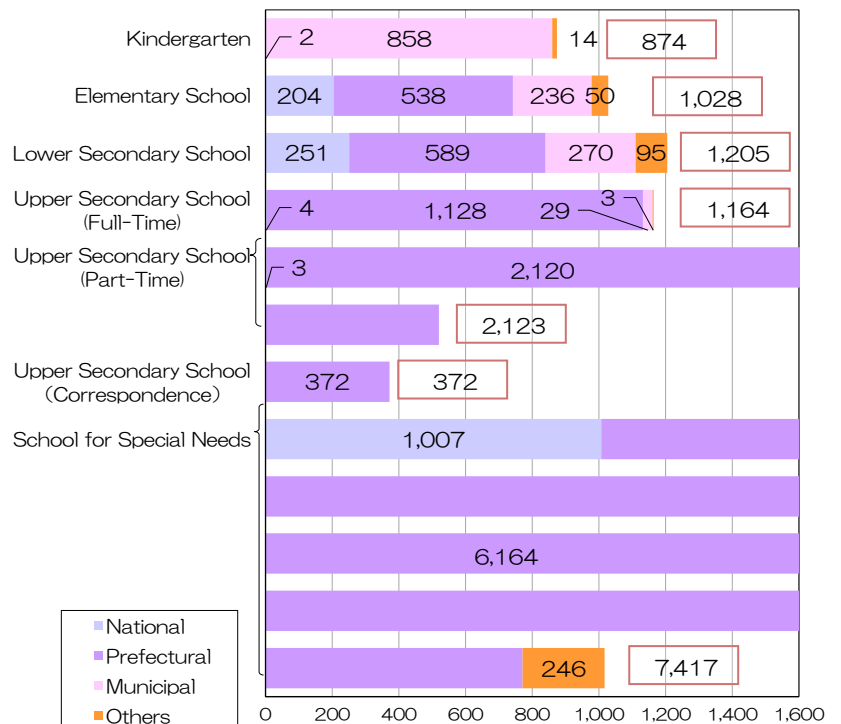

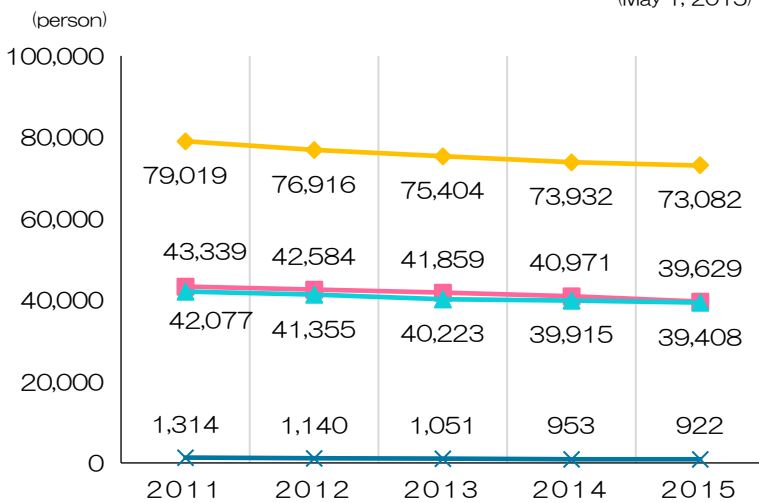

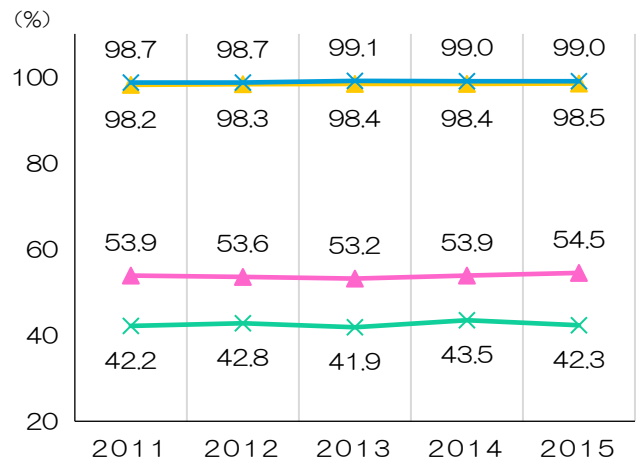

- ×— Upper Secondary School Going on to Higher Education (Prefectural)

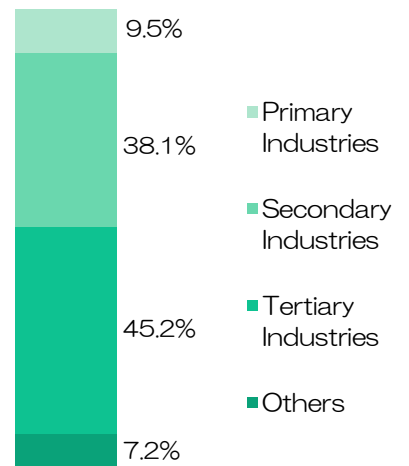
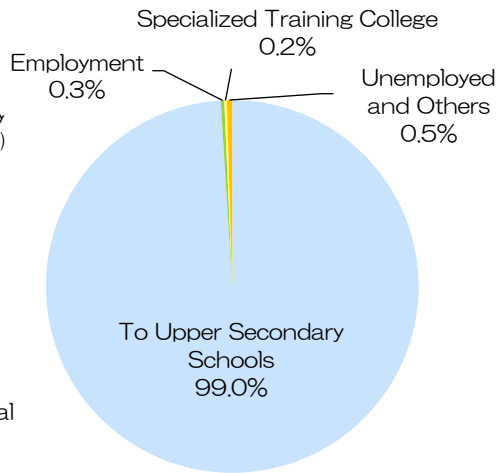
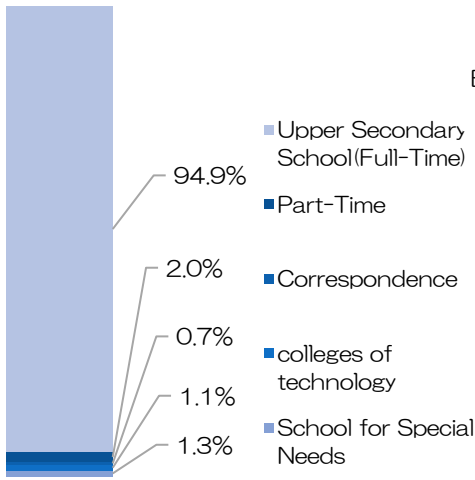

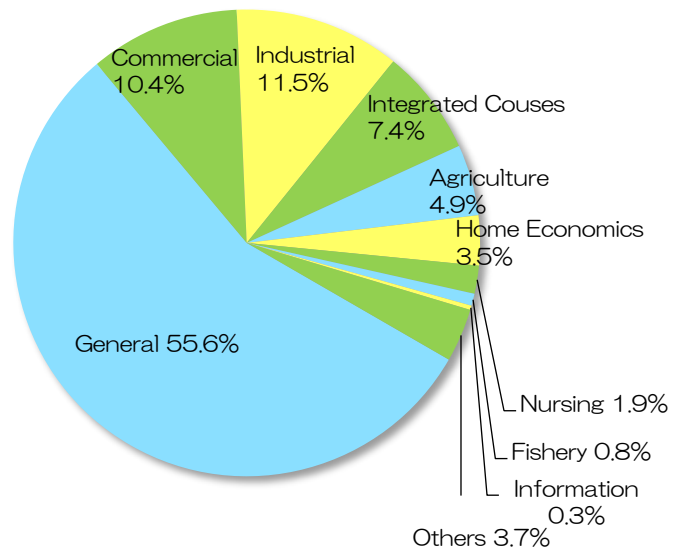

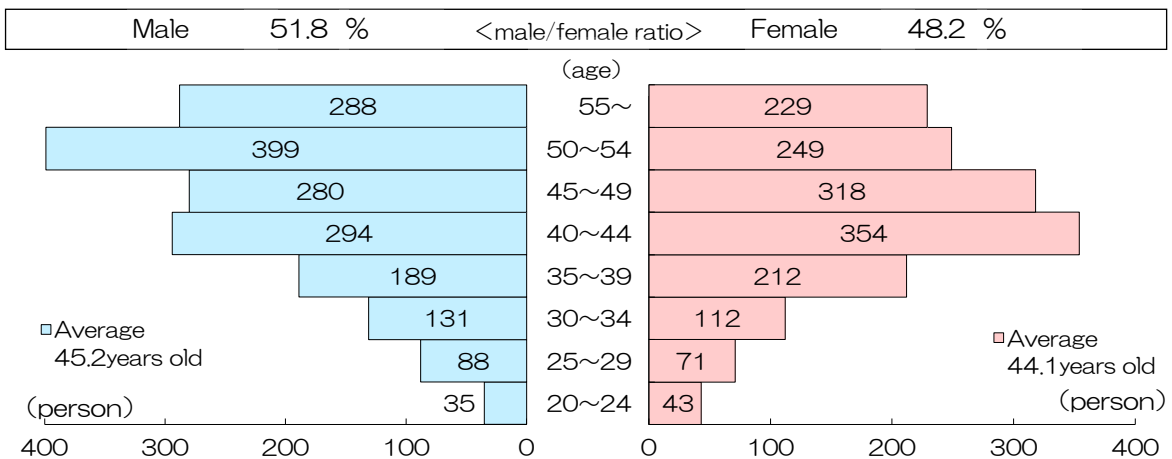
# Number of Teachers, by Age

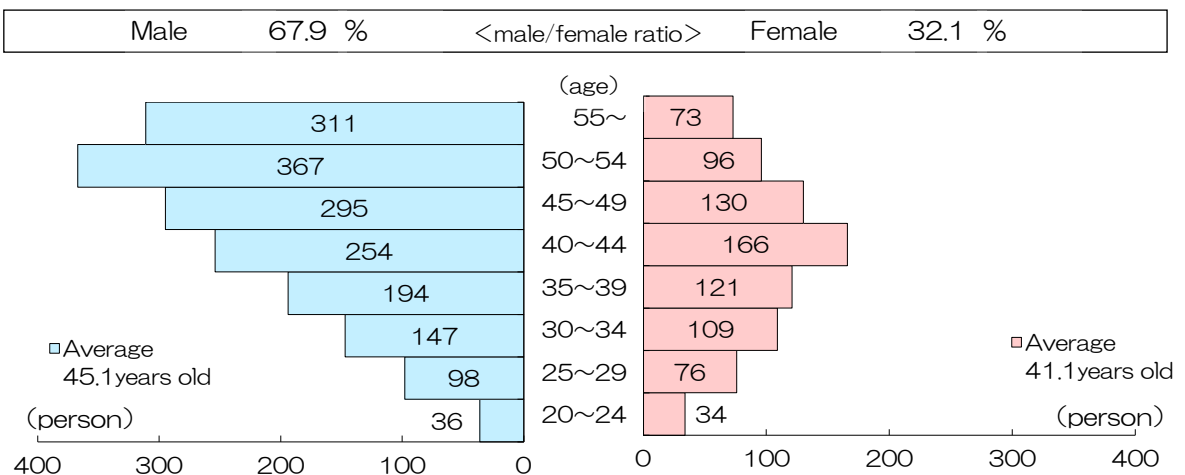

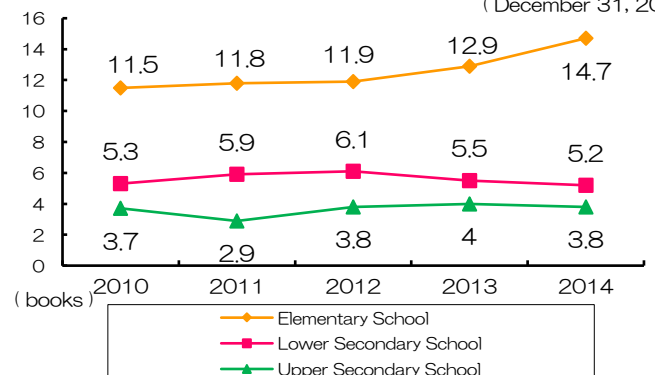

(December 31, 2014)





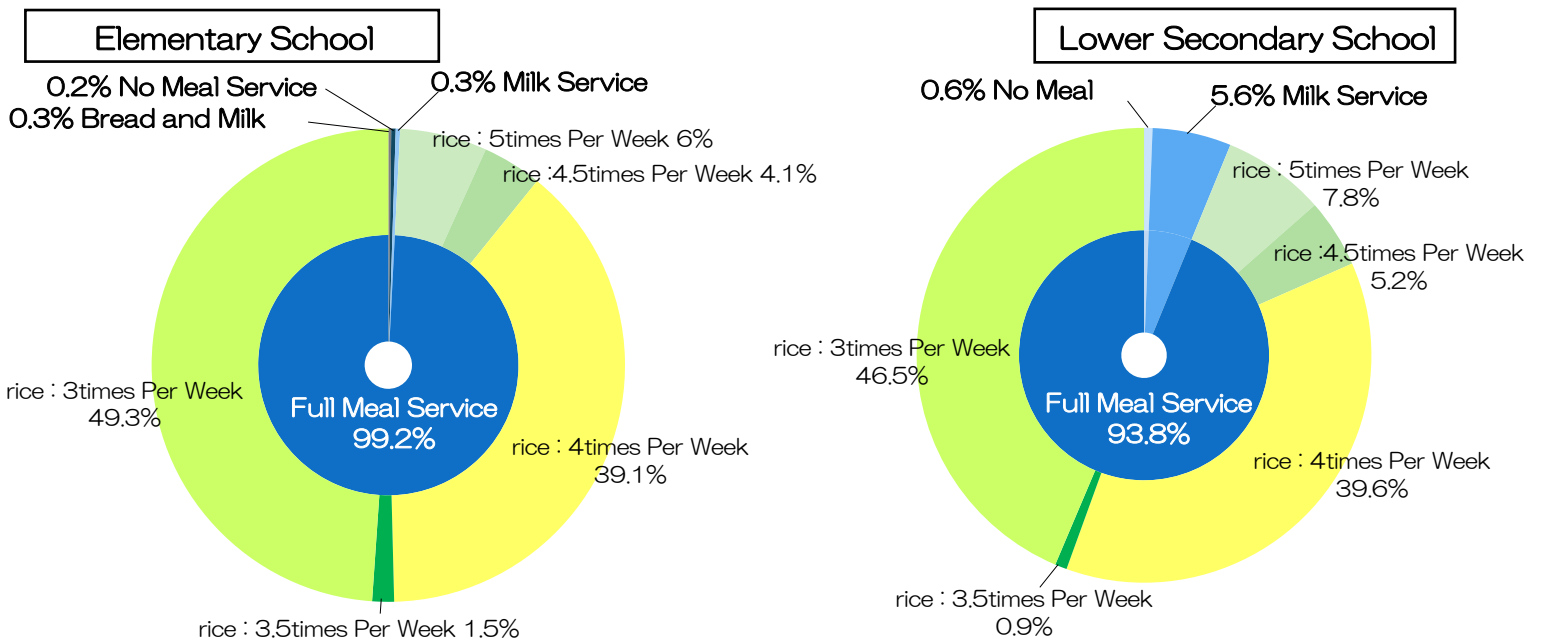

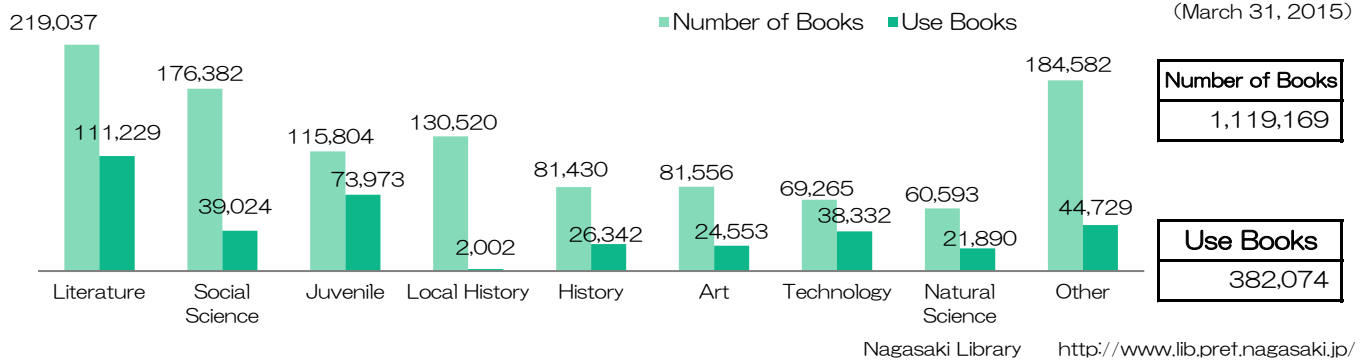

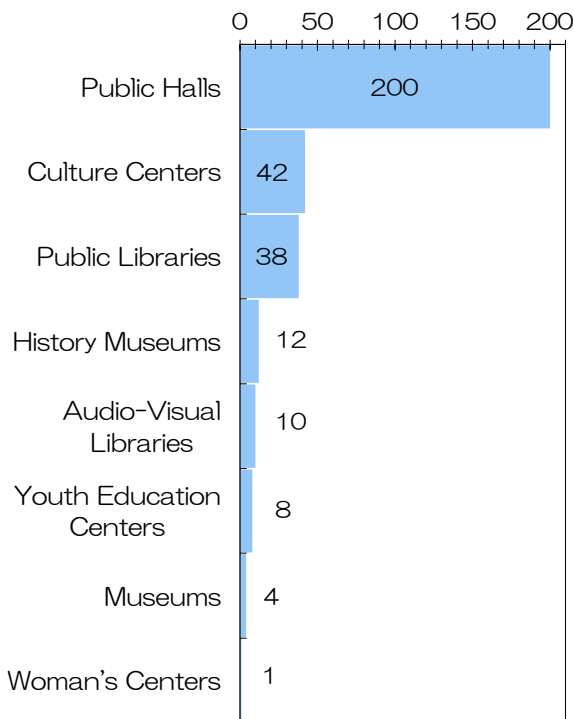

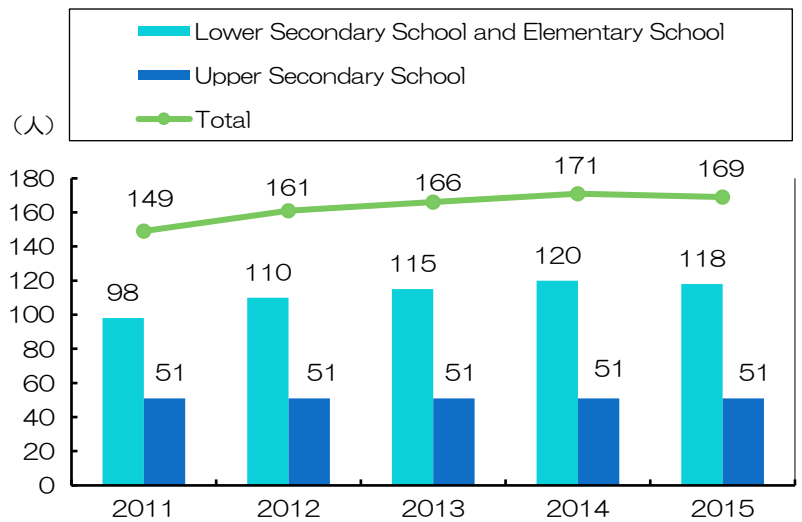

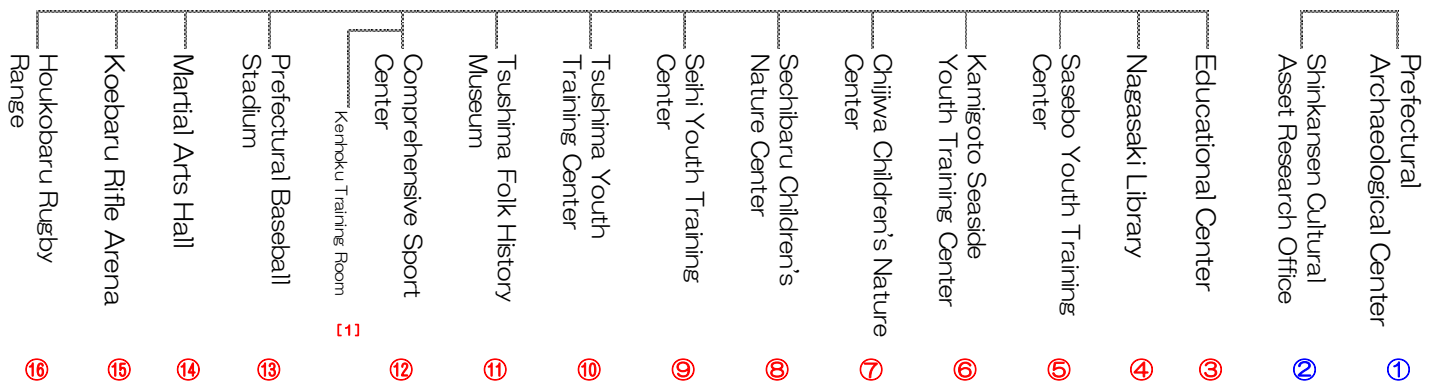
