









Changes in the Number of Students (National Public Private)




- Elementary School

- Upper Secondary School (Part-Time)


Changes of Enrollment Rate (National Public Private)




- Lower Secondary School Going on to Upper Secondary (National)

- Upper Secondary School Going on to Higher Education(Prefectural)







Percentage of Children who did not read any Books in one Month(Public)








