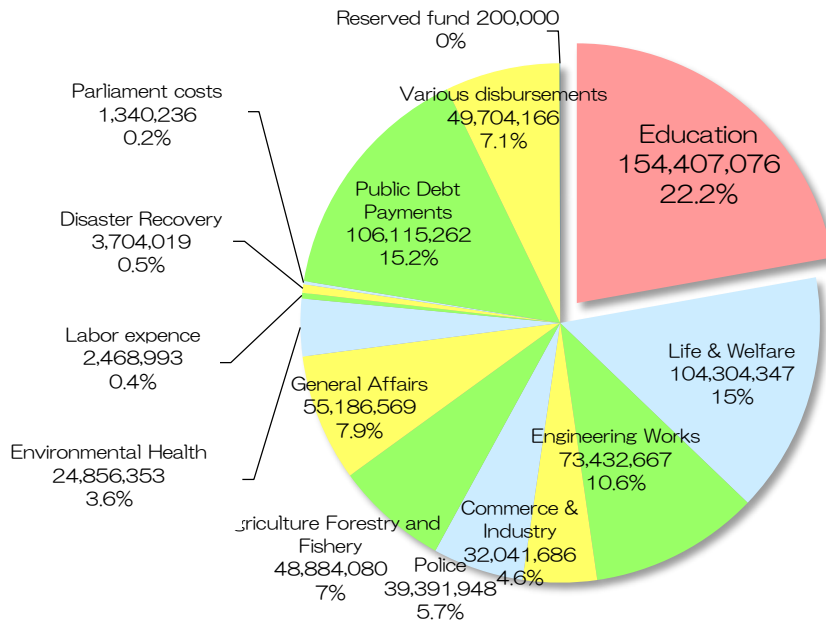

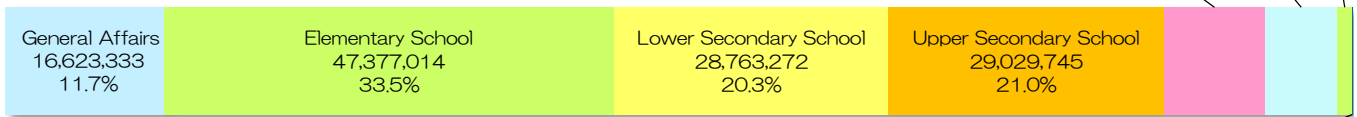

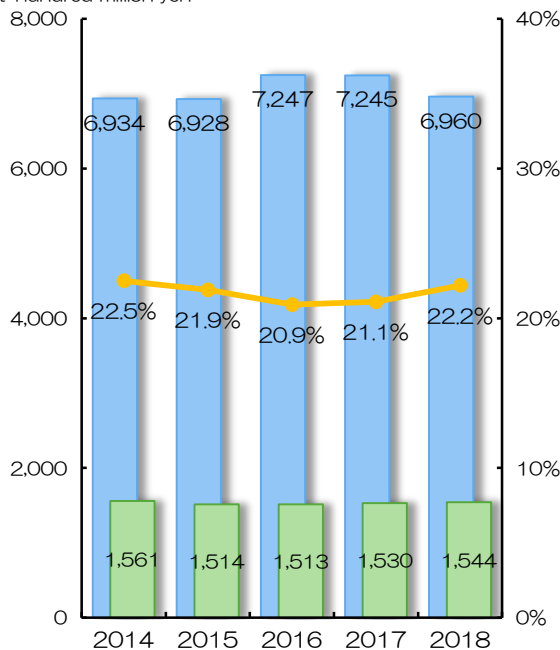

Unit: hundred million yen



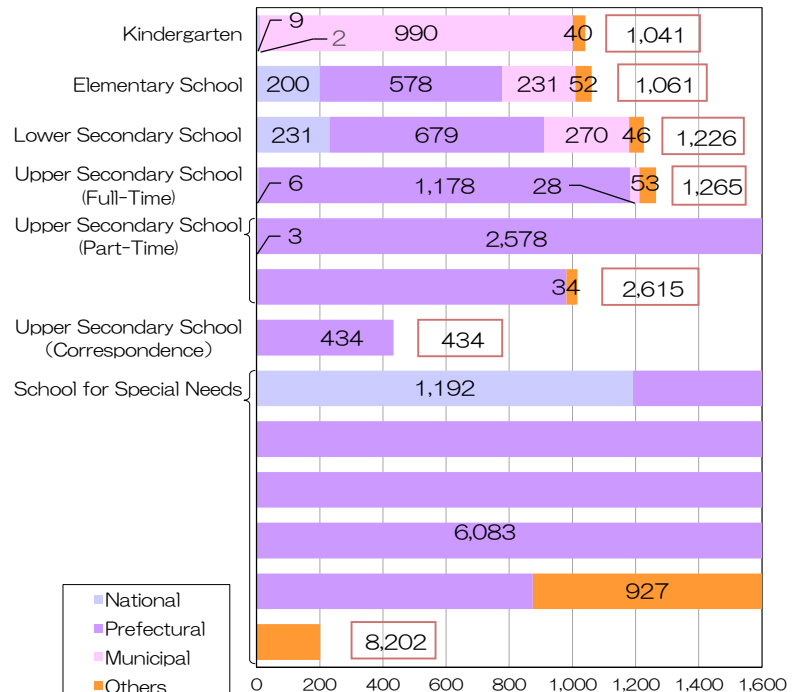

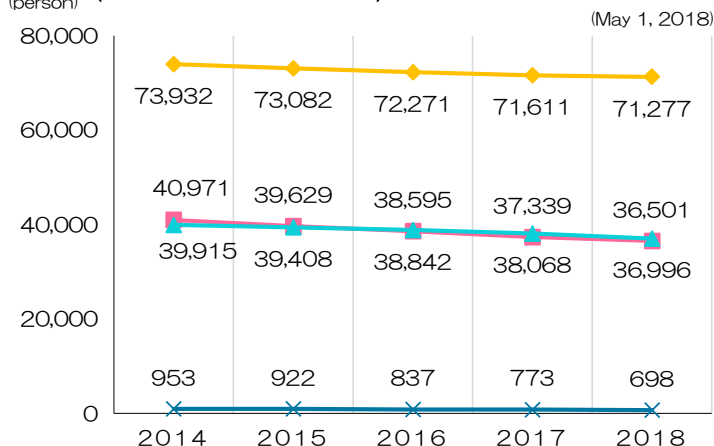

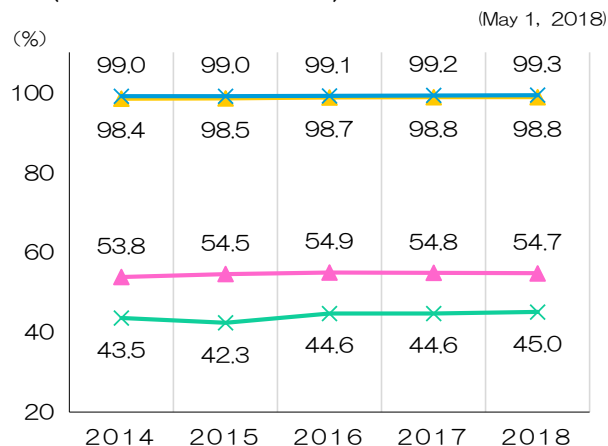

## Changes of Enrollment Rate (National·Public·Private)

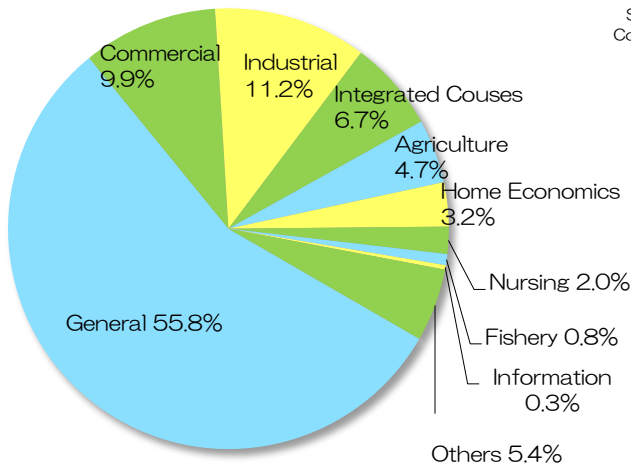


◆ Lower Secondary School Going on to Upper Secondary (National)

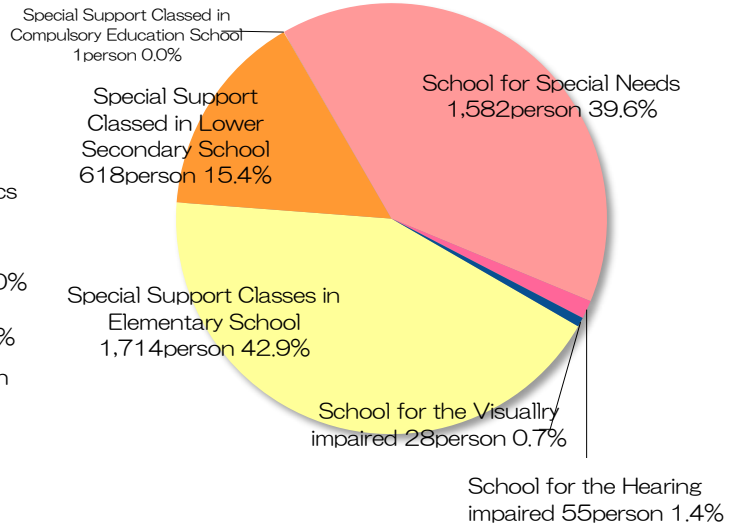

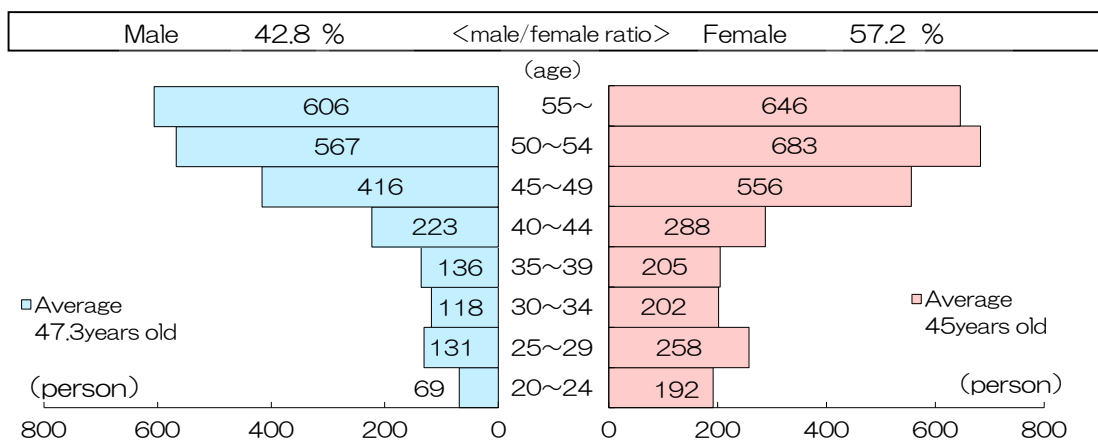

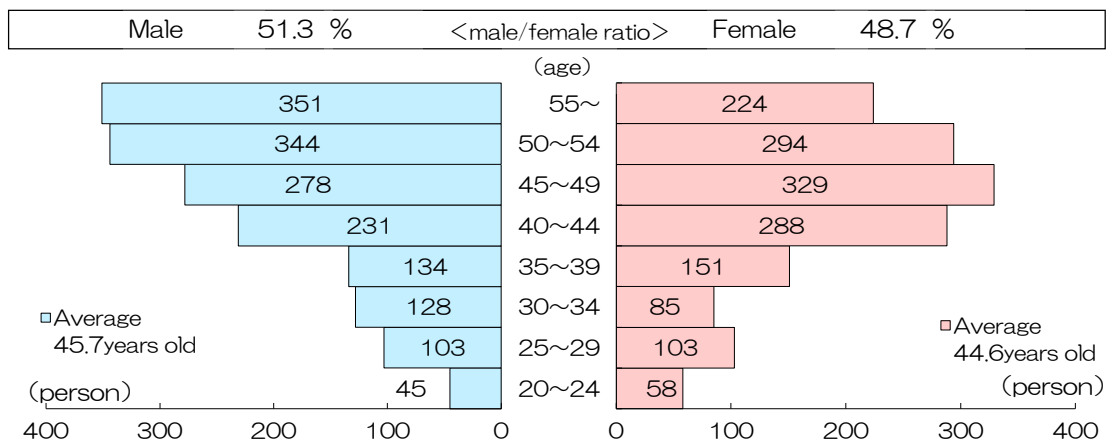
# Number of Teachers, by Age

(May 1, 2018)

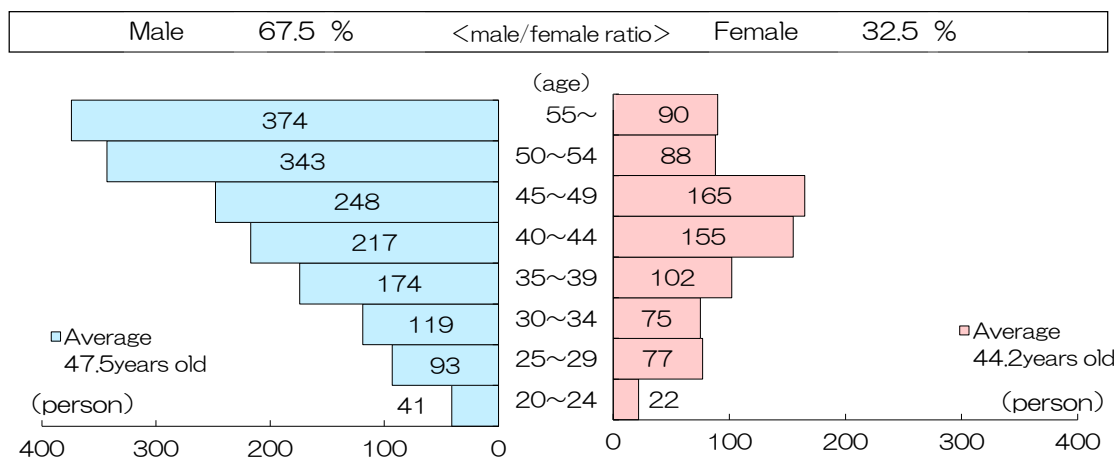

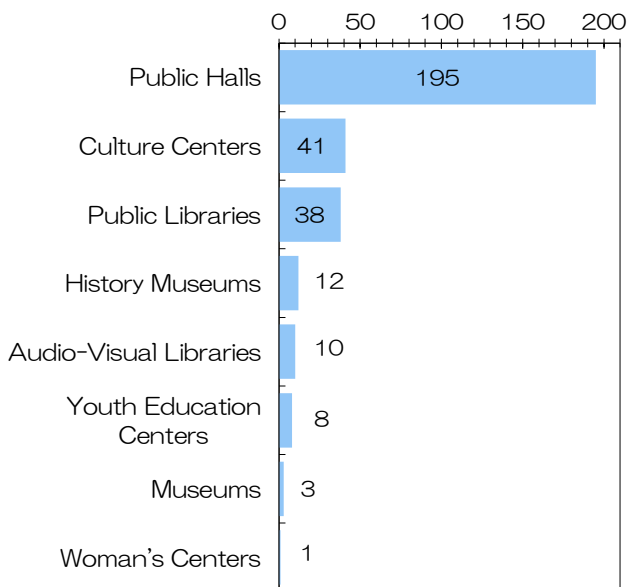

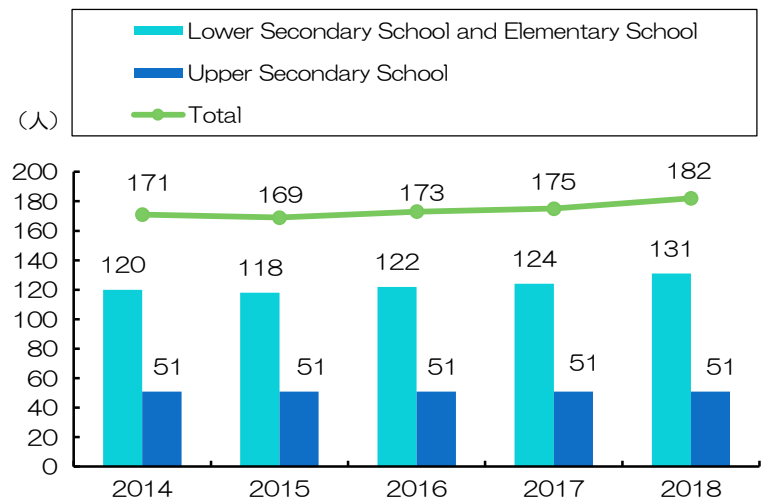

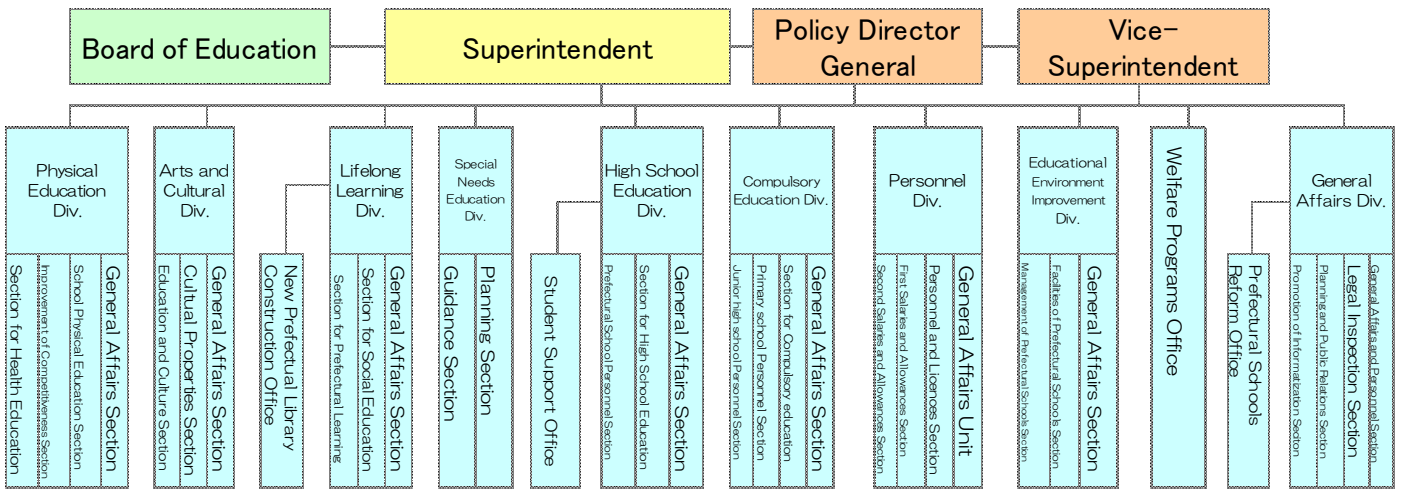
