



### Prefectural Budget and Educational Expenditures






### Prefectural Expenditure on Education





# Distribution of Upper Secondary School Students (Public · Private Upper Secondary School)










### Destinations of Graduates (National · Public · Private)











# Average Number of Books Read by Children per Month






