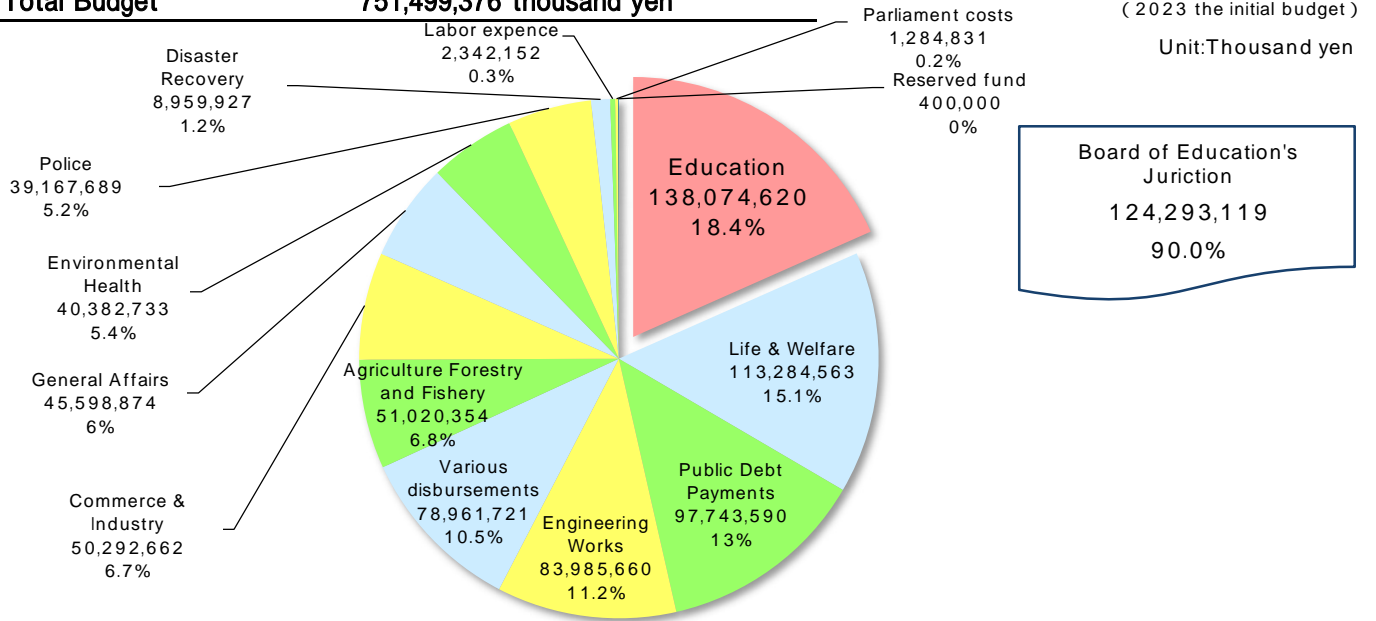

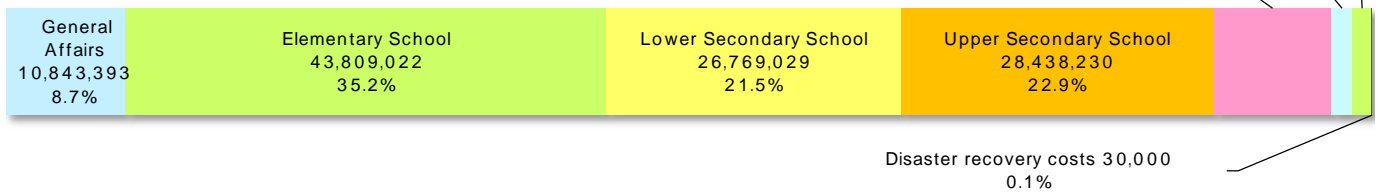
Prefectural Budget and Educational Expenditures

Total Budget 751,499,376 thousand yen



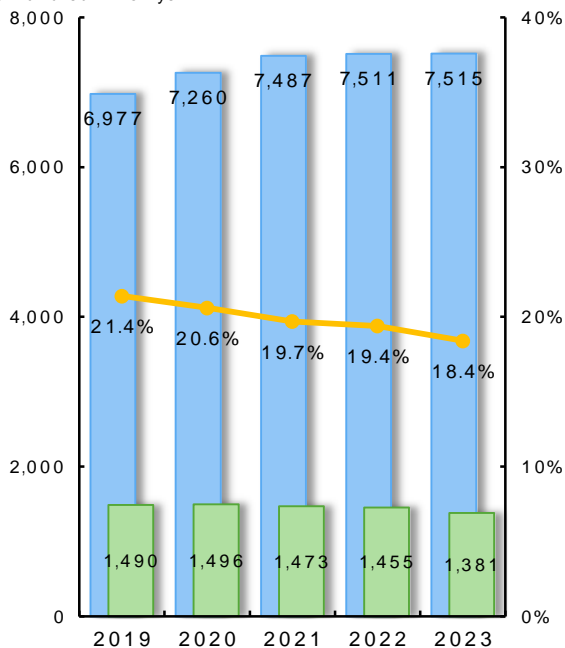

Unit: hundred million yen

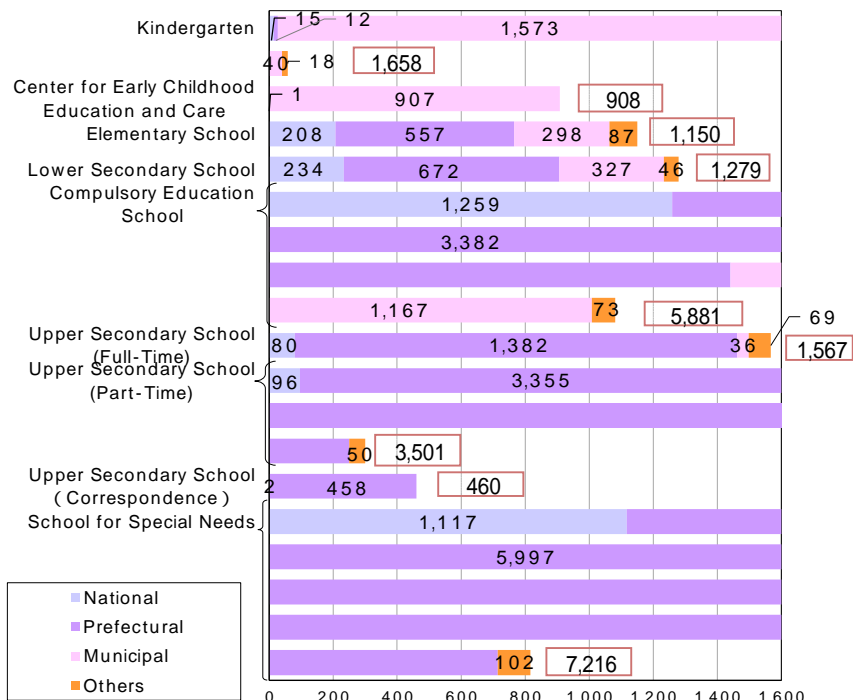


Educational Expenditure Per Student

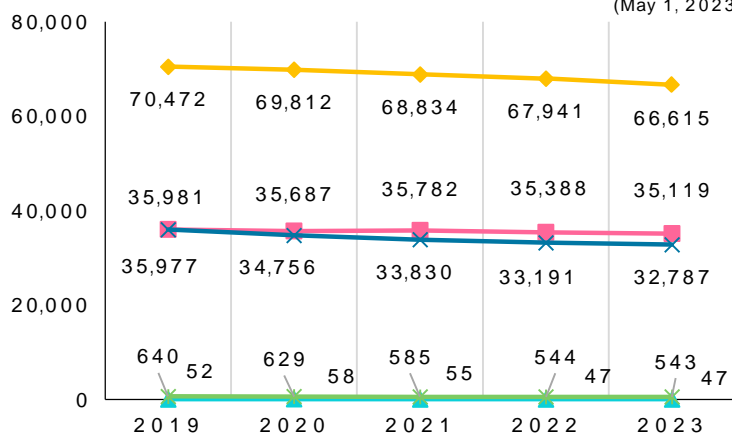

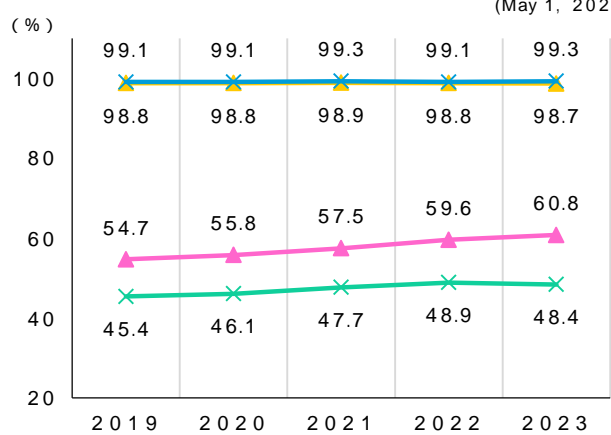

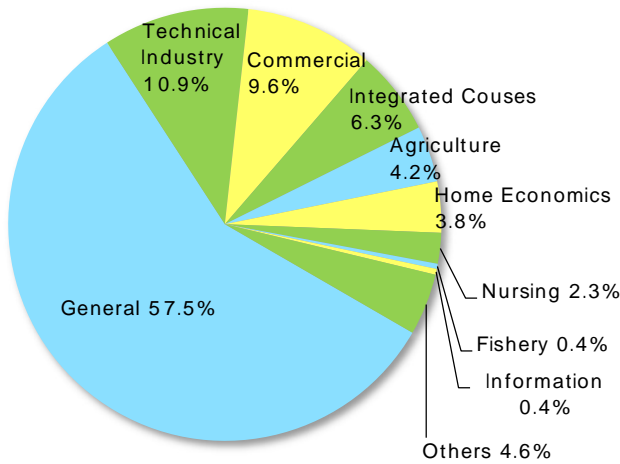

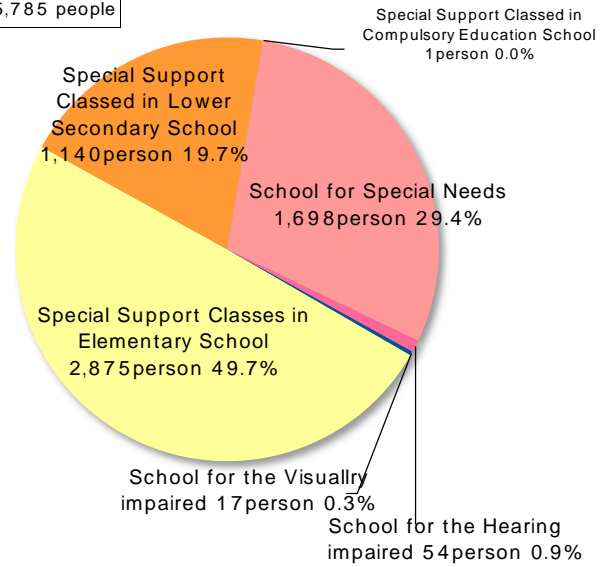

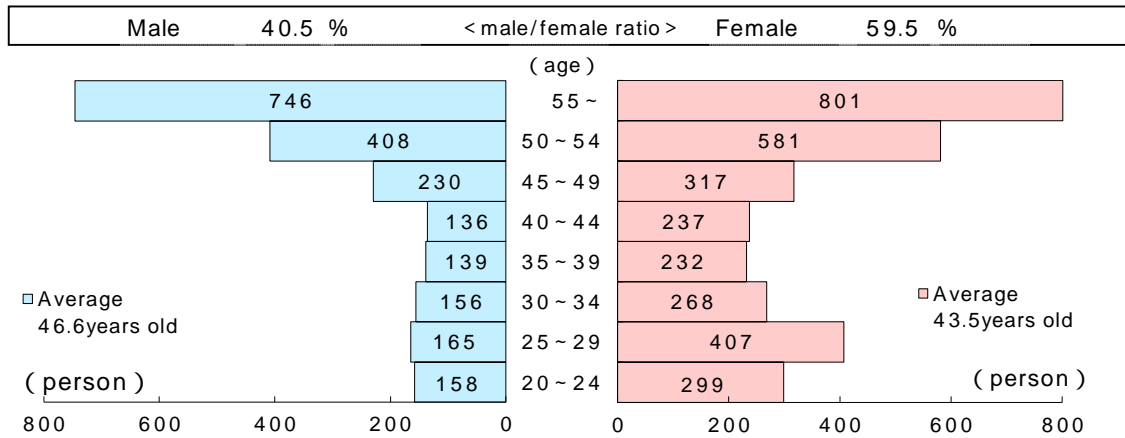

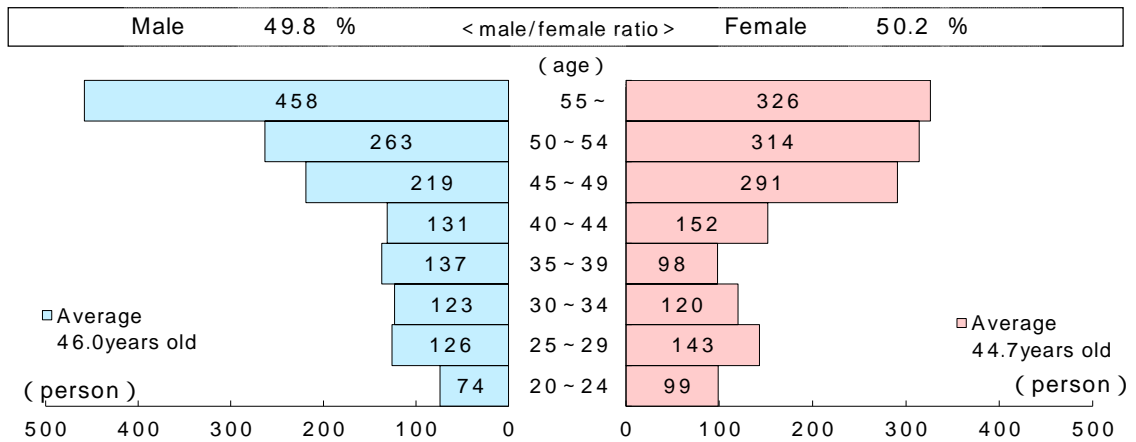
Number of Teachers , by Age

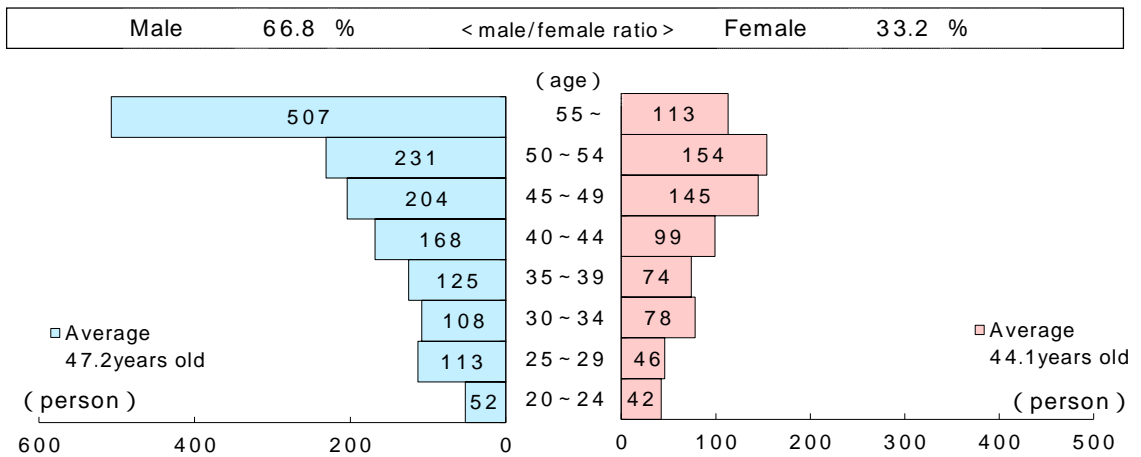

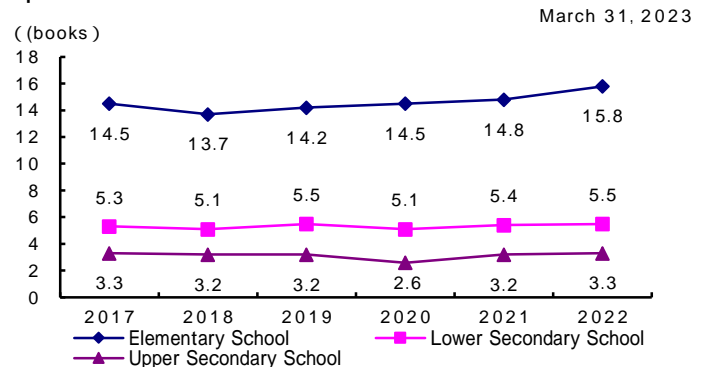

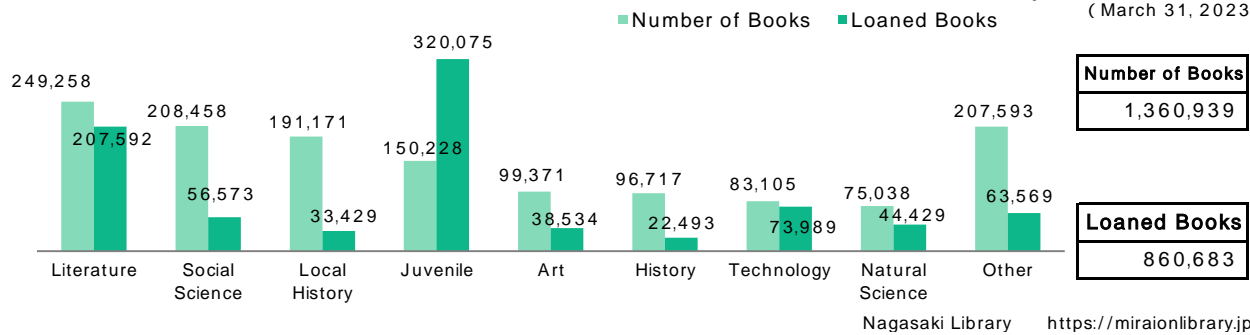

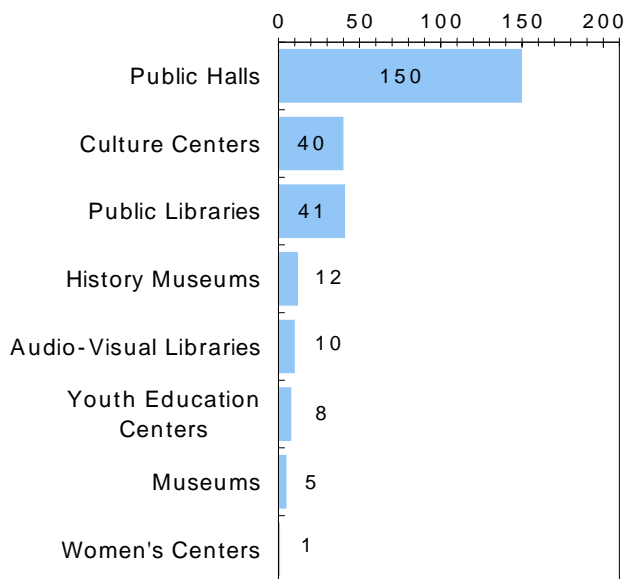

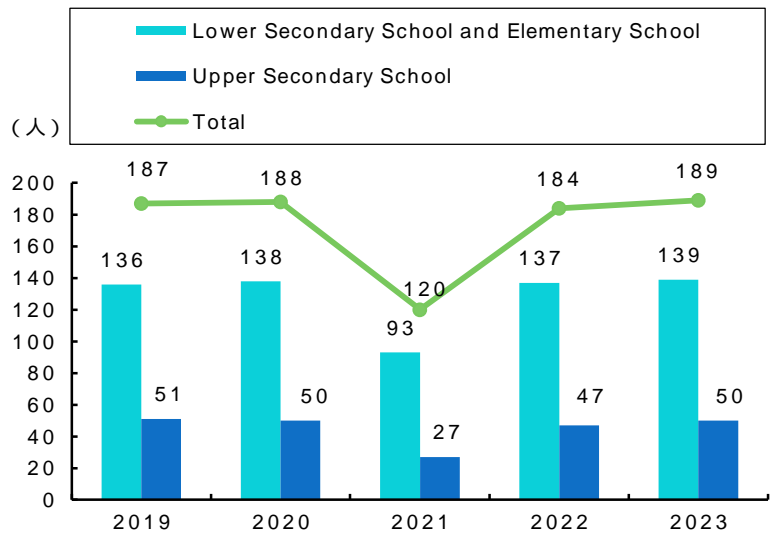

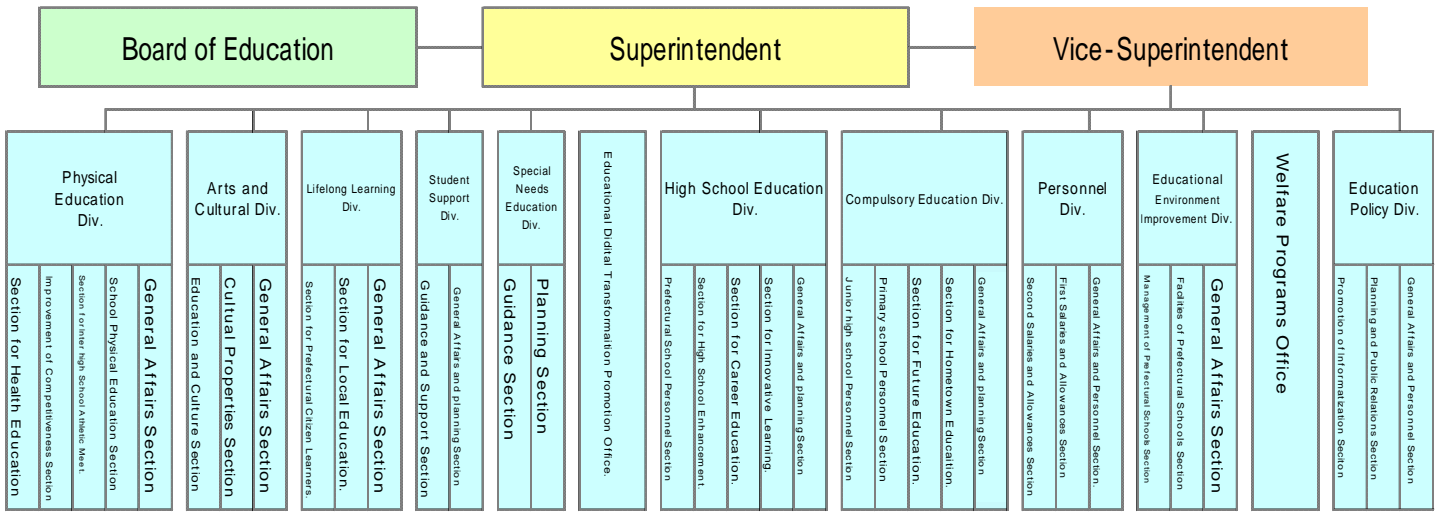
